

Botrytes tenella, Sacc.?

Dirty-white tufts issuing from interior of body & forming a continuous mass over various portions of body, but mostly on under surface

Hyphae slender, colorless, branched, generally sparingly septate, average $2\ \mu$ diameter.

Fertile hyphae forming very minute, chalky-white, globular head of conidia (only seen with magnifying glass) & about $34-36\ \mu$ diameter; variously branched, dichotomously or at right angles; ultimate branchlets becoming very much attenuated, usually zig-zag in shape, with little projecting points at each angle to which conidia are attached & ending in a knob

Conidia spherical, hyaline, regular in size & shape $1.5-2\ \mu$ diameter
