£4 "0" "0 per 100, and then all
unmounted and in the rough state."

It is not only the collecting, but the
cutting up, preparing, getting, and
fixing casts of the spores on blotting
paper, &c. And then I mount only
those that are really good specimens
destroying all those that fade, &c.
