My dear Prof. Saccardo:

In going over your manuscript on collections of Chinese fungi made by me, I find that certain points are not clear and Mr. Merrill, Director of the Bureau of Science, and I have come to the conclusion that it would be advisable for us to send a typewritten copy of the manuscript back to you for correction and criticism. I shall send this in the course of the week and should be pleased to have you make any corrections and then return the same, so that it can be published here at an early date. We shall be pleased to handle any further publications by yourself, on determinations of my fungi. In April I shall leave the Philippines for a trip to Siam and intend to make an extensive collection of fungi in that country. As I have stated before I shall be more than pleased to send the entire collection to you for determination.

I have sent some of my latter collections to Dr. Sydow in Germany. These collections have been recent ones and while it might be possible that some are duplicates of those I sent to you I have attempted only to send new forms. Dr. Sydow has suggested that I send only leaf specimens of fungi to him and the fungi on stems, branches etc. to you for determination. As I have ^{had} a few numbers of fungi on branches to him, I have suggested that he forward ^{these} directly to you. Dr. Sydow does not want to have any duplicates of this work, so that he should be pleased to have you correspond with him in this regard. I have already written to him.

I sent a few days ago
A large number of the collections on citrus are duplicates, but since they were collected from different trees and not enough material was collected from each I sent duplicates, so that you would have plenty of material for identification.
